Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you have had a good week and that your family is managing to avoid the latest round of winter bugs. We have seen a drop in attendance last week - it dipped below the national average - and we know that there has been a lot of illness. We hope that students will feel better and return to college soon. Thank you to those of you who met with teachers for the Year 10 parents' evening this week. Staff report having many positive and constructive conversations.

Social media ban for children?

This week there has been a lot of publicity around the government's decision to consult on whether there should be a national ban on young people using social media before they reach the age of 16. The government did in fact announce many other things to improve online safety too, but these got overshadowed by this one headline. You may recall that in the summer, the government introduced age verification requirements for pornographic websites, because children could freely access porn. The plan is to now introduce further measures to improve online safety for children. Ofsted inspections will now check that schools are phone-free as this is the new basic expectation. In the summer, the Department for Education will publish "evidence-based" recommendations for screen time for children between the ages of 5 and 16. Evidence from around the world will be examined on a wide range of suggested proposals and the social media consultation will seek views on a range of measures, including:

- Deciding the right minimum age for children to access social media, including consideration of a ban for children under a certain age.
- Exploring ways to improve the accuracy of age assurance for children to support the enforcement of minimum age limits so children have age-appropriate experiences and see age-appropriate content.
- Assessing whether the current digital age of consent is too low (the age at which someone can legally agree to the collection and use of their personal data online without parental permission).
- Removing or limiting functions which drive addictive or compulsive use of social media, such as 'infinite scrolling'.
- Exploring further interventions to support parents in helping their children navigate the digital landscape, for example further guidance or simpler parental controls.

I will share with you the details of how you can take part in the consultation, once the government has decided on its format and timescales.



Anyone in Year 10 can apply, but not everyone will be successful.
