Dear Parents and carers

Significant National Changes to Education

For the last few months, an independent review of England's curriculum, assessment and qualifications system has taken place, chaired by Professor Becky Francis CBE. This involved a call for evidence and views. National organisations and charities, as well as individual local education authorities, schools, colleges and parents all gave their views, Last week, Professor Francis published the review's findings and the following day the government published its response, confirming the changes it will be making to the curriculum (what students study) as well as to assessment, exams and qualifications. This review covered all key stages from year R to year 13. However, I thought it would be useful to summarise the changes affecting secondary schools for you and to explain what is likely to change at Wyvern.

- 1. Revise the national curriculum in 2027 for first teaching in Sept 2028. There will be a greater focus on critical thinking skills; a greater emphasis on digital, media and financial literacy. Schools should ensure that students are given three full years to experience the KS3 curriculum. Unlike most schools, Wyvern begins Key Stage 4 a year early from the start of Year 9, with students choosing options in year 8. We will await detailed clarification from the government but from the initial information, it looks as if we will need to change this.
- 2. Academies like Wyvern will no longer be able to deviate from the National Curriculum. All schools will be required to teach the refreshed national curriculum in each subject rather than their variation of it. This means that some topics and units of work we have chosen to engage our particular students might need to be replaced by those chosen by the government.

- 3. The government will introduce national Year 8 assessments in reading, writing and Maths to assess progress made since SATs in year 6.
- 4. The content of GCSE courses will be revised for first teaching in Sept 2029. This will involve a reduction in the overall amount of time students spend in end of Year 11 exams. In many subjects, there will be a reduction in the quantity of content that students have to know and remember for their exams.
- 5. Revise the English Language GCSE so that there is greater emphasis on spotting misinformation and disinformation (information which is inaccurate and information which is deliberately inaccurate).
- 6. Revise the Science and Geography curriculum to include more climate education.
- 7. Introduce a Natural History GCSE as an optional subject.
- 8. Revise the personal development curriculum to include strategies for self-regulation, perseverance and resilience. In RE, the government will consider and consult schools on how to replace locally agreed syllabuses with one national RE curriculum.
- 9. Revise the Design and Technology curriculum to place more emphasis on sustainability.
- 10. Reform the computing curriculum to ensure it delivers digital literacy. Computer science GCSE will be replaced by a broader course to include AI and Data Science.
- 11. Introduce a core enrichment offer of extra-curricular activities which gives students access to all of the following types of extra-curricular opportunities in schools: "civic engagement"; the arts and culture; nature, outdoor and adventure; sport and physical activities.
- 12. The EBacc (the expectation that students should study a modern foreign language and either Geography or History alongside English, Maths and Science), has been scrapped. This is a significant reversal of the previous government's guidance and Ofsted guidance which made clear that the EBacc should form the basis of most students' curriculum in Key Stage 4. This will mean that less students will study both a foreign language GCSE and a GCSE in either Geography and History, allowing for greater freedom and personalisation. We will change our options' guidance and rules for the current Year 8 when they choose their options next term, and for all subsequent year groups.

The government had also hoped to publish its plans for the reform of the Special Needs and Disabilities system but has delayed doing so in order to test its ideas out with educators and SEND organisations.

I hope this provides a useful summary for you. We will of course communicate any further updates or changes if we get any.

Safeguarding

Hampshire's domestic abuse partnership has launched a campaign called "Is this Love?" to raise awareness of coercive control. Domestic abuse is any type of controlling, bullying, threatening or violent behaviour between people who are or have been members of a family. It can seriously harm children and young people, and experiencing domestic abuse is child abuse. Because of this, exposing a child to domestic abuse is regarded as a form of child abuse ie to witness it is to experience it. The police share with us at Wyvern its reports of incidents of domestic abuse and we know from these that coercive control is increasingly being reported and investigated. We do teach children about coercive control in the curriculum and through assemblies. So, we welcome Hampshire's focus on this issue and are happy to agree to their request for us to pass onto you their campaign post and video. We have been made aware of a pop-up that is appearing in Roblox, encouraging children to download an app called pollybuzz (or pollyfuzz in some cases). The app seems quite simple where children are asked questions, and it generates an artificial intelligence friend. This starts innocently but then begins to show extreme content (including suicide, self-harm and pornography). If your child plays Roblox, please check their device for this app and remove it as soon as possible. It is a good opportunity to talk to your child about popups and the dangers of downloading apps they do not know.






