Dear Parents and carers

This week has been a really positive week at Wyvern. We have seen Year 11 students working hard in their trial exams. Our Year 9 Enterprise and Marketing students have held their Christmas Fayre in the hall, selling the products they have made and learning a huge amount about how to identify and take advantage of the Christmas gifts market. They have been so entrepreneurial and creative; I was so proud of them and their efforts. Thank you to those of you who supported them in their project. Our choir performed in Romsey Abbey last night alongside the choirs of Barton Peveril and other schools. Our Anti-Bullying Ambassadors have also been developing their skills and are preparing to be trained in their role. We have had special events for young carers this week - to support those students who need to care for a family member. On top of this, tutor groups have been busy creating Christmas window and door displays and also implementing their plans for the kindness challenge.

Each year Ofsted inspectors evaluate the quality of thousands of schools. Ofsted therefore has a very detailed understanding of what is happening in England's education system. Every year it summarises the main themes and issues which it has found in an annual report. It published the report for 2024-25 this week. It identifies that behaviour in schools continues to be a problem, with record numbers of suspensions and sanctions given across the country. In identifying the causes of this trend, the report includes this explanation: "The influence of social media, whether by chipping away at attention spans and eroding the necessary patience for learning, or by promoting disrespectful attitudes and behaviours, clearly plays a part. Access to social media for young people and mobile phone use in schools have become perennial topics of discussion. It's clear that schools need to help their pupils navigate the risks and pitfalls of their online lives, but there is no need to facilitate access on school grounds."

Last week, I attended a head teacher's conference where Ofsted inspectors talked more about the current state of education. They said that tensions between schools and families often stem from schools' expectations that all students need to conform to common boundaries and rules but that an increasing number of parents disagreed with and challenged the set boundaries and rules. At Wyvern, we have seen big reductions in the number of sanctions this year, including suspensions, and big increases in the

number of praise points. We are also fortunate that so many parents are highly supportive of the high standards we have and the boundaries we set. Indeed, it is these things which attract so many out of catchment families to apply for school places at Wyvern. However, we continue to reflect on how we can improve things even more and what we can do to further improve the way we address the causes of poor behaviour where it does happen. I have asked the Compass School in Southampton, which specialises in supporting those with social, emotional and mental health difficulties to come and evaluate our behaviour policies and practice and to guide us in setting up more specialist interventions to help these students. They begin that work with us tomorrow.

The other theme arising from Ofsted's annual report is the increase in the number of children with special needs. It raises the question of whether there really are more students with special needs or whether schools have become better at identifying these needs. Either way, the report concludes that teachers need to have greater training in this area of work. We await the government's proposals for reforming the special needs system, which is due to be published next term.

Despite the challenges facing schools and the world of education, it remains a pleasure and privilege to work with young people; I am heartened by the number and quality of people now training to be teachers and am encouraged by the wonderful things our students do - as their effort in this week's business fair, Romsey Abbey concert, kindness challenge, Year 11 trial exams, anti-bullying work and interhouse Christmas decoration competitions all show.

SCHOOL TRANSPORT & POST & TRANPORT POLICIES

Hampshire County Council is keen to remind local residents that there is still time to share their views on proposed changes to our School Transport and Post-16 Transport Policies. We would be grateful if you could share the below reminder with families. Thank you in advance for your support.

Hampshire County Council is running two consultations on its current <u>School Transport Policy</u> and its <u>Post-16</u> <u>Transport Policy for 2026/27</u>.

The consultations run until this Sunday (7 December) and seek feedback on a number of small, proposed changes to make the two policies easier to understand and provide greater clarity on how the services are delivered and managed. Alongside these basic changes to policy wording, the County Council is also proposing to withdraw the formal offer of a Spare Capacity Seats Scheme in its School Transport Policy.


