Dear Parents and carers

As we come to the final week of the autumn term, there are lots of festive activities for students to enjoy: Christmas lunches, decoration of tutor group rooms, our concert and the culmination of our kindness challenge. I am very pleased that attendance has remained strong this half term when it has slipped significantly nationally, with some schools even having to close due to the prevalence of staff illness. Thank you for all your efforts in supporting strong attendance.

Sharps, Blades and Knives in College

I am aware that this week some parents have been discussing on Facebook whether a student brought a knife into college. So, I thought it would be a good time to explain what the college does when someone reports this might be the case and the circumstances in which we will notify parents something has happened and the circumstances in which we won't.

Our policy and process are that if a student, parent, member of staff or a member of the public gives us information that suggests a student might have a sharp, blade or knife on them, the safeguarding team will respond extremely quickly. The student is spoken to, their bag and pockets are searched, and the electronic metal detecting wand is used to identify any metal objects we cannot see. Any object that is found will be instantly confiscated. We then assess the intent and context before deciding what to do next. For example, recently a student brought in a paper cutting knife to their D&T lesson and used it to cut paper. As a very new student to the college, they thought this was allowed. In the last 18 months we have had a handful of similar incidents. One student brought in a large pair of sharp scissors to a textiles lesson because they felt this cut material better than the college scissors (which are blunter for a reason!) A second had a multi-tool device in their bag from when he had been to scouts. A third came and reported themselves when they discovered they had left a knife used for fishing in their bag from staying at their dad's house over the weekend. A fourth brought in a cake knife to their food lesson. Context and intent are really crucial here. In all these cases there was no intent to harm or to glorify knives and all were accidents or students acting in good faith (albeit

misguided). The safeguarding team was able to give safeguarding guidance to the student and contact their parent to discuss this.

These situations are all very different from someone bringing in a knife with the intent to threaten, intimidate or hurt others or to show a knife off and glorify knives as weapons. If this were to happen, the item would be confiscated, the police would be called and the student would be given the most serious sanction possible. The last time we had that happen was 4 years ago when a year 7 student brought in a multi-tool device and threatened another student with it. We do educate students in knife crime and make the point that no sharp or blade, however small should be brought into college. It is pleasing that our students understand this and report any suspicions they might have.

We have to decide when to notify all parents about a sharp, blade or knife. We do not notify all parents when the motive is innocent, and there was no intent to cause harm or glorify the items. We also do not notify all parents if others suspect a student has a blade or knife, but none is found when they are fully searched. We do notify the parents of those students who have passed onto us a concern and those parents of a child who has been searched because of someone's concern. Rarely, we will need to contact the parents of all the students in a class if at the end of a lesson, the number of sharp tools or equipment being returned is less than the number handed out and if a search of the room and a search of all students in the room cannot locate it.

Please do be reassured that we work very hard to prevent and manage any incidents involving sharps, blades and knives. If you ever have a concern, please ask the safeguarding team via the usual enquiries email. Although you might be anxious about what you hear or suspect, please don't post this on social media as this simply leads to the accumulation of misinformation (false information) and even disinformation (deliberately false information) which them spreads alarm and distrust.


SMART LIVING CHRISTMAS


