Dear Parents and Carers,

The third Monday of January has been termed “blue Monday” – apparently the most depressing day of the year and certainly the combination of cold, wet, dark weather combined for failing new years resolutions does set the context for people to be unhappy. However, there has been a lot of things happening this week that show students in good spirits. The latest inter-house competition has involved tutor groups competing in a treasure hunt to find clues to identify the location of locked boxes containing prizes. Students of all ages have been keen to get involved and there has been a lot of fun and friendly rivalry taking place. The cast of Charlie and Chocolate Factory have been rehearsing with great enthusiasm and sense of fun.

This week I spent some time talking to students about their experiences in lessons to identify what works well and what we can do to improve things further. They were full of insight but also enthusiasm too. We undertake quality assurance reviews into different subject areas throughout the year and always have panels of students to help us do this. In this latest panel, students were keen to ensure that behaviour management was done more consistently across the college by different teachers and for there to be greater consistency in setting of home learning and feedback. We also had some of our students with SEND presenting to the senior leadership team about the sensory challenges in a large secondary school and provide some recommendations on how we can improve this.

The leadership team has been looking at corridor flow and congestion which the students identified as the biggest issue, and we will shortly be implementing some changes that will improve this. It is always a pleasure to work directly with students – one of the reasons why I still teach my own classes and the students are so insightful, as well as tactful when presenting suggested improvements.

The safeguarding team has seen an increase in issues related to snapchat with the sharing of unwanted inappropriate content. ## PARENT TRUSTEE RECRUITMENT

- No different from other governors or trustees

Parents are elected to the board, not appointed (unless there are fewer candidates than vacancies).

All parents are eligible to stand, and all are entitled to vote, should we have more than two candidates stand for the vacancies.




