Dear Parents and Carers,

+I hope you and your family have not been too badly affected by the recent floods. In the village where I live, many houses suffered ground floor flooding with the damage and misery this causes, though it brought the community together to look after one another and to help each other. When we look at the school closures that have taken place across the country this winter, due to flooding, storms and snow, we are very fortunate and thankful at Wyvern to have not been affected.

### Holocaust Memorial Week

This week is the anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz, the largest of the Nazi extermination camps in World War Two. We know that in the Holocaust, 11 million people were murdered, 6 million of them Jews. We have used our assemblies this week to remind students of this event and to teach them the lessons that we can all learn from this historical event: that hatred doesn't start extreme, it starts small and grows; it begins with words and stereotypes that de-humanise people; that when a group is blamed, mocked or bullied, hate can become normalised and grow into acts of violence because it is easier to justify harming them. The holocaust shows that freedom and democracy are fragile and need to be protected; that silence and indifference endangers them; that when people stop caring about each other, then anything can happen - and it did.

### Special Needs Provision

The press recently reported considerable investment into special needs' facilities across the county. Hampshire County Council has successfully attracted funding to improve special needs provision in the county. There will be new special schools set up which will provide specialist provision for different types of special needs. This includes Luminous Oak Academy - a specialist school for children with social, emotional and mental health (SEMH) needs which will be located in Boorley Green. It will provide 125 places and is due to open in September 2026.

Hampshire council has also been keen to use building developers' contributions to support provision within schools. They have allocated £1.2million pounds of funding to Wyvern for site investment and we have chosen to spend the first part of this on refurbishing our learning support department. This will not increase the capacity we have for supporting children with special needs but will mean that the learning support area will be modernised and redesigned to better meet the needs of the students we already have. In particular, we will be able to better manage the sensory needs of students and to run interventions in more appropriate settings. There will be a suite of smaller, more specialist spaces, rather than the current two large areas which

many students need to use simultaneously for different purposes. Work will begin on this project in the summer and is scheduled to be completed ready for the new academic year in September 2026. At the same time, an Art room will be converted into a photography studio. The money we have been given will also be used to increase the number of sheltered outdoor spaces, with a large canopy being constructed alongside our all-weather pitch. There will be significant money left over for a phase two of the refurbishment - and we will share these plans, once we have had them approved.

Below is the snippet from the school website which has been shared multiple times with all parents and pupils. Please do refer to this when purchasing new school trousers and be wary of the 'school section' label in shops as they may view this as a school item but that does not mean that they are in line with Wyvern's uniform policy.

Trousers	Plain mid/dark grey formal tailored trousers which cover the ankle are required. To avoid confusion: trousers made from <i>jersey fabric</i> or any stretch material that gives a jersey-like appearance (including cotton-Lycra blends, polyester-Lycra blends, viscose blends, ponte or similar knit fabrics) are not permitted. These types of trousers are often marketed as "back to school" trousers in supermarkets but do not meet the professional standard required by the college. Trousers must be structured, non-stretch, and maintain a smart tailored fit. They should be waist high with no visibility of undergarments at the waist.
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To end on some positive notes....really well done to the Year 8 boys 7 a side team who won a local football tournament at Perins School. They made it through the group stage to the final and typically took it to the wire by winning on penalties. Huge congratulations to Rhys, Mitchell, Ethan, Seb, Jacob, Reuben, Indie, Daniel, Finley and Cian.
