Dear parents and carers,

Punctuality Focus – Changes Coming After Half-Term

From the first week back after February half-term, we will be making some important changes to how we address punctuality at Wyvern.

At present, we are seeing around 1,200 lates each week across the college – to either registration or lessons. If each of those lates is just five minutes, it adds up to 100 hours of lost learning time every single week. It's a problem we are determined to tackle, and we are asking for your support.

From half-term onwards, we will be lowering the threshold at which punctuality sanctions are applied:

- 3–4 lates in a week will now result in a 30-minute detention
- 5–9 lates will trigger a 75-minute detention
- 10 or more lates will lead to an IER sanction (Internal Exclusion Room for the day, plus a 75-minute after-school detention)

We will also begin placing students who are repeatedly late over a sustained period onto our Truancy Consequences Pathway.

However, this is not just about sanctions. We are also recognising and rewarding excellent punctuality:

- Students in Years 7–10 who achieve 97%+ punctuality will meet the punctuality part of the selection criteria to be invited to join our Paulton's Park Praise Trips later this year
- Any student who achieves 100% punctuality in a week will receive a P1 reward point, which tutors are actively celebrating during tutor time

Our tutors will be leading conversations with students after half-term to reinforce these expectations, and to provide pastoral support where lateness is an ongoing issue. We know that some students face genuine challenges, and where this is the case, we are always happy to help problem-solve.

We'd be grateful if you could reinforce these messages at home:

- Talk to your child about why punctuality matters – in school, but also in life
- Encourage routines that help them be on time: packing bags the night before, setting multiple alarms, and aiming to be early rather than just on time
- Reiterate that being on time is a basic life skill – one that employers, colleges, and universities rightly expect

As a reminder, every half-term you receive an Absence Report for your child which includes a table showing the number of times they were late to registration and lessons. In the most recent report, we included the college-wide average, so you can compare your child's punctuality in context.

This is a whole-college effort, and we're grateful for the role you play in helping us embed these habits. We'll monitor the impact of these changes over the coming weeks and hope to be able to celebrate improvements in our punctuality data by the end of February.

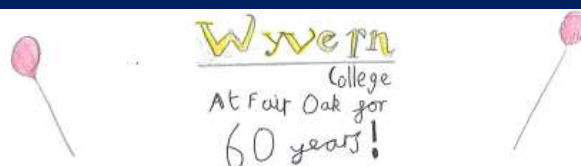


PRE-LOVED UNIFORM SALE

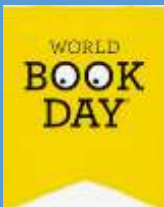
