Dear parents and carers,

It has been another busy week in the college with lots of events taking place: we have our vocal festival tonight where our students will perform alongside the students from our link infant and junior schools. We have had house assemblies this week which create a lot of excitement for our house system and the competitions they generate; we have had meetings of our young carers support groups and our bereaved students support groups. Year 10s have been working on assessments and there has been a lot of success with our sports fixtures: the year 7 girls' football team won their local tournament and we have had several students selected to represent the district for Cross Country. Year 11 students are now in the final stretch of their courses and our period 6 revision programme is now underway.

I do need to address concerns which some parents have been sharing about a member of staff, who is currently absent from work. I can confirm that the Police are currently leading an investigation into an allegation about this member of staff. Because the alleged incident took place in class, they have also spoken to some other students. As a result, some students and parents have been discussing this investigation, and this has generated wider interest and comment. This has led to some false and exaggerated accounts of what has been alleged, and comments about the member of staff concerned. It has also led to many intrusive questions and comments directed to and about the student who has made the allegation. I am asking for your help in ensuring this stops.

While I am not able to give any further details due to necessary considerations of confidentiality, I must stress that this remains an ongoing investigation which has not reached any final conclusions. It is therefore entirely inappropriate to speculate or make any assumptions, as doing so not only leads to harmful misinformation but can compromise the current investigation into this matter.

I'm sure you can all appreciate how difficult this is for everyone concerned. We must respectfully ask you and your children to not discuss or comment on this publicly (including on social media) or approach anyone who might be involved in the investigation. If your child talks about it or has already talked about it, please now remind them that without knowing the full facts, and with lots of false accounts circulating, they should not be passing on what they have heard or gossiping about those involved. Your assistance in this is anticipated and greatly appreciated.

I also want to reiterate that the safety and wellbeing of all students is always our absolute priority, and we have robust safeguarding processes in place to that end. This matter continues to be addressed in line with those processes and to be investigated appropriately. Please reassure your children that this is the case. As always, our safeguarding team is ready to talk to students and parents about any aspect of safeguarding, to listen to any concerns on a wide range of issues and to work with outside agencies where necessary to ensure issues are resolved and students get the support they need. Finally, from a practical perspective, we have been looking carefully at how best to support students' learning in the classes impacted by the staff member's absence, including sourcing additional specialist staffing where it is available.

I will keep you updated with developments in this matter if and when I am able to share them with you.
