As we approach the end of another term, I would like to thank you for your support of the college and your involvement in your child's education.

Year 11 Revision Expectations over Easter

The Easter holidays are a crucial time for Year 11 students to consolidate their learning ahead of final exams. Students should aim to complete around 3–5 hours of focused revision per day, broken into manageable chunks of 45–60 minutes with regular short breaks to maintain concentration. A structured revision timetable is essential, allowing time to revisit key topics, memorise essential information, practise past exam questions, and focus on areas of weakness. It is also important that students balance their revision with rest, exercise, and good sleep to stay motivated and avoid burnout. As parents and carers, you can support by helping your child plan a realistic daily schedule, ensuring they have a quiet space to study, and encouraging them to stick to their routine. Gentle check-ins, encouragement, rewards and keeping a calm, positive home environment will help your child feel supported, confident, and ready for the exam period.

Super-curricular activities

If your child has a passion for a particular subject they might want to undertake a super curricular activity in it during the Easter break. Super-curricular activities are voluntary and for students who wish to extend or depend their interest in a subject. They can involve research projects, competitions, trips/visits, podcasts and extended reading. Child Happiness Survey

Last week saw the launch of the 2026 World Happiness Report, and this year's theme is Happiness and Social Media. There are some interesting headlines from this survey. The Nordic countries retain the top spots in the world happiness rankings, Finland is No.1 (again!), followed by Iceland then Denmark; Costa Rica has jumped to 4th place. Young people's happiness is falling in English-speaking countries. In places like North America and Western Europe, young people are significantly less happy than 15 years ago, unlike most of the world, where youth wellbeing has improved. Heavy social media use is linked to lower wellbeing. On average, those who use social media for longer periods report lower life satisfaction than light users. Not all screen time is equal. Activities like messaging, learning, and creating content are linked to higher wellbeing, while passive scrolling, gaming, and "browsing for fun" are linked to lower wellbeing. How social media is designed really matters. Platforms that encourage connection tend to support happiness, while those driven by algorithms, influencers, and comparison tend to harm it. Many people feel 'trapped' using social media. A lot of users say they'd actually prefer social media didn't exist, but they keep using it because everyone else does. Connection in real life matters far more. Feeling a sense of belonging (e.g. at school or in community) has a much bigger impact on happiness than reducing social media use alone.

Safeguarding: VPNs

schools across the country are reporting a growing trend in the increased use of VPNs (Virtual Private Networks) by young people since the Online Safety Act came into force over the summer. A VPN is a piece of software or an app that changes how a device connects to the internet. It can hide a user's real location, mask online activity and make it appear as though the device is in another country. VPNs are used by adults for legitimate reasons, such as privacy or secure working. However, they are not designed for children and can pose safeguarding risks when misused. Since the introduction of the Online Safety Act, many online platforms and sites have strengthened: Age-verification, Content filtering and Safety restrictions.

In response, some children are using VPNs to Bypass parental controls and device restrictions, Bypass government regulations or laws, Access age-restricted websites or apps and Hide online activity from adults. This can include access to content that is inappropriate, harmful, or unsafe, and can make it much harder for parents and schools to protect young people online.

We recommend that parents:

Check devices for VPN apps (these often appear as "VPN", "Secure", "Private Browser" or similar)

- Talk openly with your child about why VPNs are unsafe for them to use
- Reinforce clear rules about internet and device use
- Keep parental controls and device software up to date
- Encourage children to talk to a trusted adult if they encounter something worrying online



Please pay particular attention to the student's **legal name**, as this is exactly how it will appear on their final GCSE certificates. If there are any errors—such as incorrect spellings or missing middle names—please notify us as soon as possible as corrections made **after** GCSE certificates have been issued incur an amendment charge, so it is essential that any inaccuracies are identified now.
