The UK port industry is the second largest in Europe and Associated British Ports (ABP) is the largest port operator in our country, with 21 ports strategically positioned around Britain.

Our ports include Immingham, the UK's largest port by tonnage, and Southampton, the UK's number one port for cars and cruise and the nation's second largest container port.

Every year, ABP handles around 25% of all UK seaborne trade, that's around 60 million tonnes of cargo.

Collectively our ports handle around 1.3 million containers, over a million vehicles and around 2.6 million cruise and ferry passengers each year. We also own Britain's busiest inland rail terminal, Hams Hall.

Apprenticeship

opportunities include but are not limited to:



Engineering

A 4-year programme where you can work as an Electrical Engineer or a Maintenance and Engineering Technician, whilst studying towards a Level 3 Apprenticeship.

To qualify for this programme you will need GCSEs including English and Maths (Level 4 or C) and a Full UK Drivers License.



Marine Pilot

There is also the opportunity to be a Marine Pilot in two years, whilst studying for a Level 5 Apprenticeship.

In order to considered for this programme you will need the Officer of the Watch Certificate of Competency Unlimited, with 12 months sea time as Officer of the Watch.



Marine Operations

During this programme you can gain hands on experience as Marine Operations Officer and achieve a Level 3 Apprenticeship within 3 years.

To qualify for this programme you will need GCSEs including English and Maths (Level 4 or C) and a Full UK Drivers License.



Operations

Study towards a Level 2
Apprenticeship whilst working as a Port Operative during the 12-18 month programme.

You must be 18 years or over to apply for this programme and have a Full UK Drivers License.

We offer various apprenticeships in our ports around the UK. Please review our careers site for more details on our programmes.

We may ask you to complete some online assessments, a telephone interview or an online assessment day.

We recommend that you prepare well and keep our top tips in mind!

Tip 1: For the application

Read the job description carefully and remember to explain how you meet the requirements. Mention all relevant achievements. Tell us about your career aspirations and why you're the right match for ABP.

Tip 2: For the telephone interview

Make sure you find a quiet place to conduct the interview where you won't be disturbed. If you are using a mobile phone, make sure you have good network coverage and your battery is going to last. Research ABP and make sure you prepare as much as possible. We want to hear about you, so think about when you've solved a problem, taken the lead or shown initiative. Ask questions.

Tip 3: For the assessment centre/interview

Speak up! If you don't contribute, we can't get to know you. Prepare! Understand the business area that you want to move into. Relax! There are no trick questions and we want you to be the best you can be.
