## Parent Newsletter Update - Changes to Uniform and Lesson Permissions

We hope this message finds you well. As we approach the Easter break, we would like to inform you about some important updates coming into effect after Easter regarding our uniform standards and the procedure for students requesting permission to leave lessons. We are sharing these updates now to ensure you have plenty of time to discuss any queries with our pastoral team and to replace any uniform items over the Easter break if required.

At Wyvern, we maintain high standards for uniform because it helps create a positive and focused learning environment. We enforce strict uniform expectations to prevent situations where some students wear fashionable variations, as this can lead to peer pressure, bullying, and negatively impact students' self-esteem. Allowing fashionable or designer items could also put undue pressure on parents to purchase expensive clothing to keep up with others. Our aim is to avoid publicly highlighting differences in fashion or financial status among students. Additionally, adhering to a consistent uniform fosters self-discipline and prepares students for professional expectations in their future careers. We strongly encourage our students to express their creativity and individuality through their character, accomplishments, and positive contributions to the school community, rather than through their clothing or personal items.

## Uniform Standards - Proud of Wyvern (POW)

We remain committed to maintaining high standards in students' appearance and appreciate your continued support in upholding these expectations. A professional and inclusive learning environment benefits all students, fostering a sense of belonging and focus. To ensure consistency across the school, we will be introducing clearer digital systems from next term to help monitor and uphold uniform standards effectively. One key update is regarding temporary uniform passes. **If there is a valid temporary reason why your child cannot wear the correct school uniform, please ensure you notify the pastoral office in advance by email or give your child a written note which they need to show their tutor.** The pastoral team will then issue a **temporary uniform pass** to your child, or your tutor will sign the written note, clearly indicating the expiry date. This pass or note will prevent your child from receiving POW points up until the expiry date if they are challenged by staff about uniform infringements during the school day.

To support consistency, uniform infringements will be logged digitally by staff throughout the day. POW points are used solely to record uniform infringements, ensuring consistency in monitoring and addressing any recurring issues. If a student receives multiple POW points for uniform infringements, threshold sanctions will apply. These sanctions will include detentions or time in the internal exclusion room. Students with uniform issues may be placed in our internal exclusion room until the issues are resolved, e.g. school shoes are brought into school by the parent. Tutors will also endeavour to contact and work with parents to resolve any recurring uniform concerns.

We would like to take this opportunity to remind families of some specific areas where we have seen repeated uniform issues:

- **Nose studs are not permitted** – having it done recently is not a reason for a nose stud or retainer to be worn in college.
- **Trainers, of any kind, including Nike and Mallets, are not school shoes** – students must wear formal school shoes that comply with our uniform policy.
- **Our uniform policy is socks or tights, not both** – please ensure your child follows this expectation.

We are also excited to introduce new praise categories next term:

- **P2 Award** for students with perfect POW records over a term. 10 house points.
- **P3 Award** for students maintaining a perfect POW record for an entire school year. 50 house points.

These awards will recognise and celebrate students who consistently meet our uniform standards, which the overwhelming majority of our students do.

For your convenience, we have attached a **reminder of the school uniform policy** along with a **set of frequently asked questions about uniform expectations** to help clarify any concerns.

### **Uniform Expectations in Warmer Weather**

We would also like to reassure families that, as always, we take a reasonable and pragmatic approach to uniform expectations during periods of hot weather. The health, safety, and comfort of our students remain a priority, and we will continue to monitor weather forecasts carefully. On particularly warm days, we will notify students and families in advance of any temporary adjustments, such as permitting students to remove blazers and jumpers, or allowing them to wear their PE kit to school. These decisions will be communicated clearly through our usual channels and will reflect the same common-sense approach we have always taken to seasonal changes.

### **Permission to Leave Lessons**

From next term, we will introduce a new system involving **Permission to Leave Lesson Lanyards**, which students must wear whenever they leave a lesson without a pre-issued pass. This new procedure allows staff to quickly identify students who have legitimate permission to be out of lessons, helping us maintain high standards of attendance and safeguarding.

Students without a permanent pass must:

- Request permission from their teacher to leave the lesson, excluding the first and last ten minutes.
- Receive and wear a **Permission to Leave Lesson Lanyard** from their teacher.
- Place their mobile phone on the teacher's desk during the time they are out of the class. This is to address a relatively infrequent, but important issue we have in college of a small number of students out of lessons co-ordinating meet ups and then causing disruption.
- Return the lanyard immediately upon their return to the lesson.

Teachers will log each instance digitally, ensuring accurate records and efficient management of permissions. Only one student at a time will be permitted to leave a lesson without a permanent pass to ensure minimal disruption.

Students with permanent passes will continue to follow existing procedures as indicated on their passes.

We understand that adapting to these changes may require preparation and discussion. Our pastoral teams are ready and available to support you should you have any queries or concerns. **Please do not hesitate to get in touch before the Easter break if you require assistance with correcting uniform issues or clarification.**

Thank you once again for your ongoing support in helping Wyvern uphold our proud standards and high expectations. We look forward to your continued cooperation in ensuring a smooth implementation of these updates.

### House Games Round Up

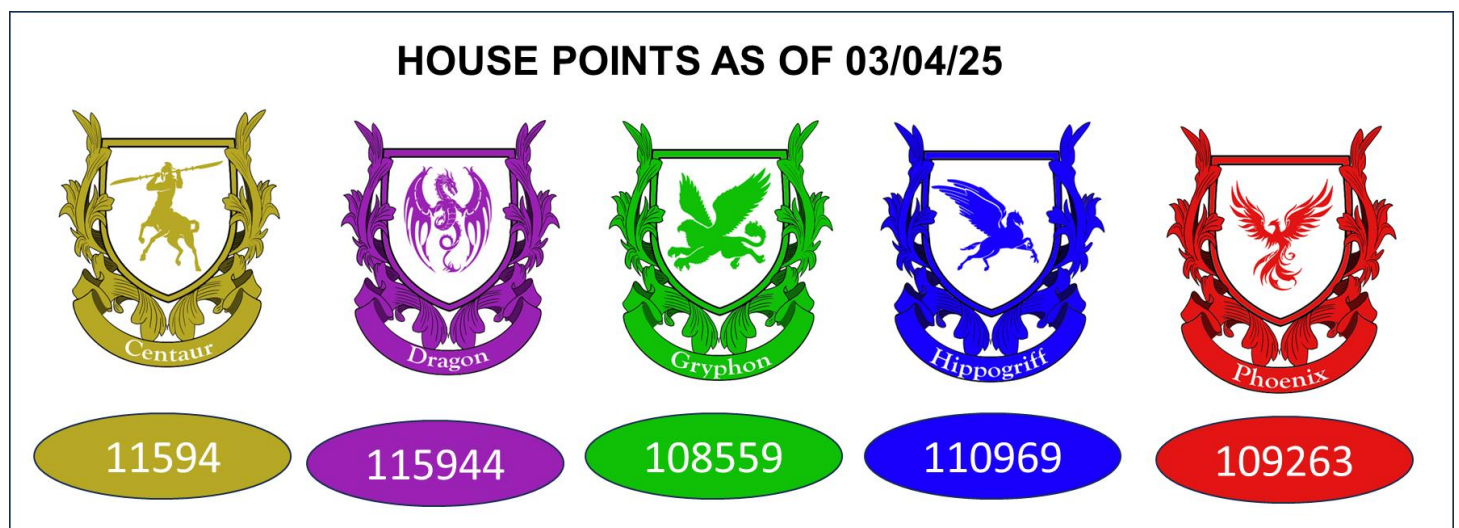
Our first house assembly of the term was a little different, as we our house captains were hidden and tutor groups had to solve several puzzles to find out where, and a code to open a box full of chocolate.

We are pleased to launch the additional Evening and Saturday revision sessions for Yr11 students. [Please click here which sessions are being offered](#), these are in addition to the regular period 6 lessons which run each week.

I am sharing this information with Yr11 students in assembly on Friday 4<sup>th</sup> April and encouraging them to attend should they wish to do so, and they have also seen the schedule during tutor time earlier this week.

The additional evening and Saturday sessions have proved popular in the past and some of them are capped at a certain number, therefore places will be issued on first come first served basis. That said, these sessions are not for everyone, and many students may prefer their own independent revision outside school hours.

As these sessions are run over and above contracted time, we do pay staff for running the sessions, and we charge to cover some of the costs. Sessions in the evenings are £5 per session and Saturday's are £10 per session.
