Dear parents and carers,

It has been great to see the students again after their half term holiday. They have made a positive start to the second half of the summer term, and managed thundery and wet weather with maturity. Despite the showers, Sports Studies' students have been doing their outdoor activity days, Geography students have undertaken field work to Swanage, our athletics team has competed in the district trials and our Duke of Edinburgh students will be completing their Bronze expedition at the weekend. Our young carers support group has also met this week – this is an important support group for those students who need to undertake caring responsibilities at home due to difficult family circumstances. Our anti-bullying ambassadors have also met and they are currently reviewing the anti-bullying policy for the college and the reflection activities that we give those who have exhibited bullying behaviours to undertake during their sanctions. Members of the pastoral and safeguarding teams have been visiting year 6 students in their current school as part of our support work for them coming to Wyvern in September.

As I reported a few weeks' ago, our trustees (governors) have met with students to find out what their experience of Wyvern is like. I am now able to provide you with the feedback from this activity and would like to thank our trustees for giving their time to come into college to do this really important work. The trustees used two ways of collecting student feedback; firstly, they met with a large number of them in discussion groups and secondly they asked a cross section of tutor groups to reflect on some further questions to assess whether they feel a sense of belonging within the college community.

One of the strongest themes throughout the feedback was the importance of positive relationships with staff. Many students described teachers and support staff as welcoming, understanding and supportive. Students clearly value staff who take time to listen, show kindness and create positive classroom environments. Their feelings of safety, confidence and belonging were clearly linked to the feeling of being respected by staff. Students consistently identified friendships and social interaction as central to feeling part of the school community. They value the opportunities to socialise during breaktimes, on trips, in clubs and during extracurricular activities. The importance of feeling accepted by peers was a major factor in students reporting positive feelings. Students spoke very positively about opportunities beyond lessons. Activities such as productions, sporting events, trips and clubs were strongly associated with their enjoyment and belonging. Students also appreciated opportunities to represent the school and described feelings of pride in being part of Wyvern. A significant number of students described Wyvern as a safe and supportive environment. Students also recognised improvements around bullying reporting and response and appreciated clear reporting systems when problems occur. Students explained that they know what to do if they witness incidents and feel able to seek help from staff.

Students were also able to give us feedback on things they would like to see improved next. Some students raised concerns regarding consistency in how behaviour systems and rules are applied. There was also a perception among some students that disruptive behaviour can sometimes receive more attention than students who quietly struggle academically. Some students expressed concern about the quantity of home learning. More universally, students indicated that they would value greater communication and involvement in decision-making. Several students identified environmental and social improvements that could positively affect school experience such as more seating, more green spaces and better areas to socialise. As the leadership team looks to refine the college improvement plan for next year, we will incorporate many of these issues in our work.

A recent Barnardo's study of 4,000 girls and boys aged 13 to 20 uncovered online misogynist abuse and harassment is 'constant, corrosive and deeply embedded' in young people's lives; that 57% of boys have called a girl a degrading name. In this survey, a fifth of boys say their friends would not back them if they challenged sexist comments; 59% said they feel they need to act tough and not show emotion. This Metro article was published last week, detailing the misogynist words and language that is now being used, with the meanings. Hot Weather Arrangements



Several parents have contacted the college to enquire about uniform in higher temperatures. We would like to clarify our position on uniform during periods of hot weather.

While we do not operate a designated “summer uniform,” the Senior Leadership Team monitors projected weather forecasts closely. In the event of extreme conditions where high temperatures are anticipated over a sustained period, we may permit students to wear PE kit.

Should such measures be required, this will be communicated to parents and students in advance of the relevant date. The upcoming warm weather is expected to fall within the half term break, so no changes are necessary currently. We trust that students, their families, and staff will enjoy the sunny spell safely.
