Dear Parents and carers

Tomorrow we are holding a non-school uniform day to raise funds for our Kindness Challenge. Each tutor group will raise money from students paying £1 to wear non-uniform. With the money they raise, they need to plan how they will spend it to in an act of kindness for other people. The tutor group can spend it however they want. Within each year group, the tutor group with the best way of spreading kindness with their money will win 100 house points. Please do support our kindness project here by paying £1 for your child to wear non-uniform tomorrow.

Halloween is next week, during the half term holiday and it is a popular time for students to be with their friends outside in the community and at parties. We know that many families and organisations might take advantage of the half term break to hold bonfire night celebrations early too. This should be a time of fun and we want students to be able to enjoy such events safely. However, as previous years have shown, when large number so teenagers are out and about, groups which supply drugs and vapes to young people are also very active, sometimes with weapons to protect what they want to sell. It is therefore important that students are aware of this danger and take precautions to keep themselves safe.

Our advice to students is that they should make sure they tell you where they are going, who they are with and let you know if this changes by phoning you; they should have fully charged their phone before they go out. They should have on their phone the number of several safe contacts who they could call in an emergency; that they should call these if they see or hear anything that does suggest there could be trouble; that they should not have cash with them which provides them with the easiest excuse for not buying anything they don't want to.

Following on from my message last week about being seen in the dark when crossing roads, Halloween is a time when pedestrian injuries and road traffic accidents increase significantly as people cross the road quickly in the dark, often when distracted by other things.

I give these safeguarding messages about Halloween not to stop young people from enjoying the event but on the contrary, so they can take part in them safely, which is a condition for being able to enjoy them.

I include a second safeguarding alert this week as the pastoral offices have advised me that some students are accessing OME TV. The age limit for OmeTV is 18+. This adult rating is due to its potential for inappropriate content and user behaviour. Despite this recommendation, OmeTV does not verify users' ages, so underage individuals may still use the platform. The platform can expose users to inappropriate behaviour, such as sexualized content, discrimination, or threats, even with its community chat rules. Due to the lack of age verification and the potential for exposure to adult content, it is important for parents to be vigilant here and ensure through appropriate checks and controls that your child is not accessing it. Once again, when some student access adult sites online, there can be peer pressure for others to do the same.

ROADWORKS WARNING

We have received the following information from SGN, the owner and operator of the gas network in our area

High Street Twyford - 20 October until 21 November

Our engineers will be working in High Street, Twyford outside New House to the junction of Main Road. To allow road users to safely pass our work site, we will need to install temporary multi-way signals for the duration of the work.

Main Road, Twyford – 3 November until 22 January 2026.

We will be working in Main Road from the junction of Highbridge Road to the junction of Manor Farm Green. Temporary multi-way signals will be in place to allow road users to safely pass the work site.

Main Road, Twyford Moors – 24 November until 5 February 2026

Our engineers will be working in Main Road, Twyford Moors from the junction of Highbridge Road to the junction of Woodland Drove. Multi-way signals will enable road users to safely pass the work site.

Main Road, Colden Common – January 2026 – end of March 2026

We will be working in Main Road, Colden Common from outside Wessex Park to the junction of Woodland Drove. Multi-way signals will be in place during this time.

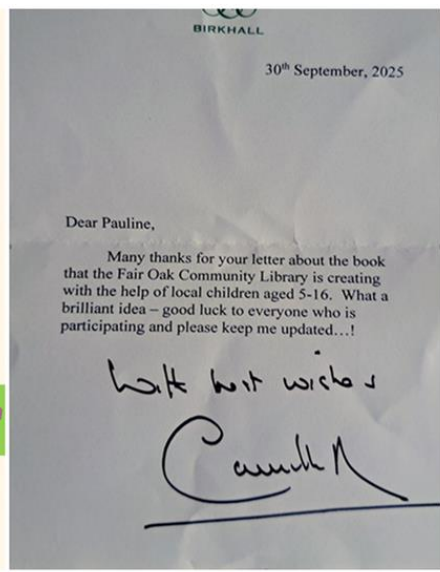
