ASSEMBLIES FOR THE COMING WEEK: All Years – English Assemblies – Shakespeare Week

Dear parents and Carers,

Today is the 80th anniversary of VE Day when people celebrated the end of the second world war in Europe, following the surrender of Nazi Germany. Our History Club students have been spending time researching local stories of VE day and taking part in commemorative events in the village. They visited residents from Sunnybank House who were children when VE Day was celebrated and enjoyed listening to their stories of the end of the war. They then revisited the residents and listened to a presentation on how Spitfire parts were made in the local area, following the bombing of the factories that had been making them. They then created an exhibition in Fountains Cafe of their wider research into VE Day, which repeated the exhibition they had created for D-Day last June. The History Club was originally created for students in years 7 and 8 but it is great to see that students in years 9-11 are still part of it because they have not wanted to leave! Thank you to Mrs McNay who has led the club and planned its events.



There were many things which led to the allied victory over Hitler; a key lesson for us to learn is that when we work hard, endure hardship, show courage, believe in ourselves and to stick together then we can achieve extraordinary things, including overcoming terrible fear and suffering. We recognise each November, those in our local community who died in service of our country and the cause of freedom so that victory could be secured, and it is fitting that in VE Day week we remember them too. Happy VE day to our elderly neighbours in the local area who were alive in 1945 and have memories of that significant event.

Wyvern students have been busy in other ways this week too. Year 8 students visited Parliament and the Supreme Court this week and were superbly behaved - thank you to Mrs Wiseman for taking them - we also have Liz Jarvis, the MP for Eastleigh visiting the college tomorrow. Year 10 students were awarded their prefect ties this week and have begun to undertake their responsibilities. As with the History Club, all these students have been great ambassadors for the college and superb role models.

Paulton's Park Praise Trip – Invitations Going Out Soon!

We are excited to share that invitations for our Paulton's Park Praise Trip 2025 will shortly be going out to students who have met the criteria we set earlier in the year. The trip will be offered at cost price. Subsidised support will be available on a case-by-case basis for students eligible for Pupil Premium.

We are inviting every student in Years 7–10 who has met the following criteria between October half-term and 15th May 2025:

- No unauthorised absences (to be clear, this was to avoid unfairly penalising students who had genuine illness)
- 97% or higher punctuality to lessons
- No truancy
- No more than three C3 sanctions
- No C4 sanctions
- Achieving an average PRIDE score of 7 or higher in the summer term PRIDE reports (PRIDE scores are out of 10 this year)

We have been very clear all year that this would be the criteria for attending the Praise Trip, including:

- Assemblies during the week of 30th September
- Information shared in thisWeek@Wyvern during the weeks of 30th September and 21st October

We also reminded parents of the no unauthorised absence requirement in the attendance reports issued during the Autumn 2 and Spring 2 terms.


Please note that if a student had an unauthorised absence recorded earlier in the year (for example, due to an illness that was not reported to us), we will not be retrospectively changing these to authorised in order for a student to attend the trip. However, if new information comes to light, we are happy to update our attendance records internally.

Naturally, we understand that some students will be disappointed if they do not receive an invitation. We hope, though, that they will view it as a positive learning opportunity. Students in Years 7–9 will have the chance to meet the criteria again next year as we intend to run these Praise Trips annually.

If a parent feels that their child should have been invited but was not, the only appeals we will consider are on the grounds of administrative error against the above criteria. If you believe this may apply, please do contact us – we will check our records carefully and get back to you.

Finally, we would like to thank all parents and carers for your support this year. We are very much looking forward to rewarding students who have consistently met our high expectations with what promises to be a fantastic day out at Paulton's Park!

SOUTHAMPTON UNIVERSITY - ENIGMA STUDY
Is your child aged between 11-15 with a diagnosis of autism?

The ENIGMA study is looking for adolescents aged 11-15 with a diagnosis of autism to help find out how the environment of an autistic adolescent can affect their mental health.

We know that autistic adolescents sometimes have mental health difficulties such as anxiety or low mood. We want to study the lives of autistic young people to try and understand why these difficulties might happen. If you and your child wish to be involved, we will ask you and your child to attend the University of Southampton 5 times to complete some tasks, and we will ask your child to wear a small sensor for a few days that measures their heart rate and breathing while they go about their life.

We will also ask your child to download an app on their phone (or on your phone) that asks questions about their mood, how they are feeling, and what they do in their free time.

NEWS ROUND UP

Pothole Survey – the Results!

Greetings Parents, staff and family members, thank you to everyone who filled out our survey about potholes in our local area and the problems that come with them. We received almost 100 replies to our Google form and we thank you very much for the data that you helped us collect. We found out that over 80% of all participants of our survey have had a negative opinion of potholes with just under 80% of these having physical problems with potholes in our area.

As a part of one of our questions we asked you, "Do you know where potholes are located locally?", and by far the two most common responses were, Allington Lane and Sandy Lane and this helps us understand that they are the areas that are some of the worst affected and we will ask that more funding be allocated to places such as those.

We ask again for your help but this time we are taking action against potholes. We have set up a petition and we ask for you to please sign it. We are asking for extra funding and time to go towards fixing and filling potholes. Please send this to your neighbours, friends and family to help raise awareness.
