ASSEMBLIES FOR THE COMING WEEK: All Years – Pastoral Leader Assemblies

Dear parents and Carers,

I hope your child was able to enjoy the half term break, doing things they do not often get time to do in term time. It has been great to talk to them about what they got up to and to see them return to college with such a positive attitude. Staff continue to work hard to support the year 11 students with their GCSEs and the after school and weekend revision sessions continue. Staff have also been working hard to provide a number of trips in the next few weeks too: we have students going out to Swanage and on Duke of Edinburgh expeditions this week; on the Black Country and Urban Field work trips the following week; the battlefields trip later in the term and we have our trip to Paulton's park for students who have achieved the best possible standards of behaviour, attendance and punctuality throughout the year. We are fortunate to also have many talented sports performers who will be competing in district and county athletics competitions. Staff tell me that it is always a pleasure to take Wyvern students out on field work, fixtures, competitions and trips. They are particularly impressed with how grateful students are and that so many of them thank staff for doing all the organising to give them these opportunities.

The May half term holiday is the deadline date for staff to notify the college that they are leaving and head teachers around the country are therefore busy recruiting replacement staff for September. We do have staff leaving at the end of this term. I am pleased that in all cases these are for positive reasons: retirement, relocation, promotion and for temporary maternity leave. I am also pleased that we have been able to appoint some high-quality new staff for September. We continue to benefit from teachers in other Hampshire schools seeking out employment at Wyvern and for the first time since Covid we have seen a very strong number and quality of trainee teachers seeking their first teaching post. It is pleasing to see that once again good people want to enter the teaching profession. I am keen to maintain a balance of experience and youthfulness to our staff body and feel we will have achieved this for September. We are going to be fully staffed with subject specialists. I have been able to slightly overstaff the English, Maths and Science department to allow for some intervention work to take place for targeted groups of students.

Safeguarding

In today's digital age, emojis have become a universal language used across texts, social media and messaging apps. With the recent release of Netflix's Adolescence, which explores the digital lives of teenagers, the use of emojis has been highlighted as a potential area of concern. While most emojis are harmless and fun, it is also true that teens sometimes communicate with them in ways that fly under the radar of adults, using

innocent looking symbols to convey meanings that are concerning. Sometimes these emojis are linked to bullying, inappropriate content or even illegal activity such as drugs. So, I thought it would be useful to include a short section in this week's newsletter to help you understand the double meanings of some of these seemingly innocent icons.

These symbols are not inherently harmful, and context is key. But when used together or in a specific context they can reflect exposure to toxic or extremist content online. We often advise parents to use monitoring tools to check that their child is saying and doing online but of equal importance is open communication between you and your child. You might like to start a conversation with them about how they use emojis and what these mean to them; to ask them about what the trends are. It's worth checking regularly which platforms your child is using the reading how your child interacts with others online. Open communication about things creates the safe space for children to talk to you if they see anything concerning which can then be reported to our safeguarding team.

	Drop the truth-sometimes linked to extremist or aggressive views
	Used to mock people who haven't woken up to Red Pill views
	Refers to the belief that 80% of women are only attracted to 20% of men - used to justify misogynistic beliefs

As a reminder, students were selected based on the following criteria between October half-term and 16th May:


- No unauthorised absences






