ASSEMBLIES FOR THE COMING WEEK: Safeguarding Team Assemblies

Dear parents and Carers,

Since our last newsletter, we have marked a significant milestone for our Year 11 students, who gathered for their leavers' assembly and prom. It was a brilliant day and evening and a fitting farewell to a fantastic year group. We are so proud of how far they've come and wish them the very best for the future as they move on to the next exciting chapter of their lives. Already, year 10 students are preparing for their life after Wyvern too; the majority of the year group attended Barton Peveril's open day and we were pleased with the feedback that Wyvern students stood out for their impeccable behaviour and interest.

On Friday, we also had our latest INSET day. Most teachers were working with their departmental colleagues on curriculum and assessment: improving the plans of what gets taught and how it gets assessed in their subject. Pastoral and safeguarding staff received training on how to support children suffering from bereavement (delivered by the child bereavement charity Simon Says) and trauma (delivered by some of Hampshire's Educational Psychologists). The staff who will be joining us in September also visited us for the day so we could induct them in Wyvern' key policies and processes.

This week, we have seen the hottest temperatures this year in the college and I do need your help in reminding students to drink more water than usual to stay hydrated, as well as to apply sun cream. On Tuesday we did decide to close the all-weather picture for break 2 and redeploy duty staff to the sports hall so students could be in the coolest place in the college. The high temperatures are forecast to remain until the end of term, although forecasts can change. We will therefore retain the hot weather uniform of PE kit until further notice.

Safeguarding: Snus

Snus is a tobacco product that usually comes in the form of small pouches that are placed between the gum and the upper lip. When used, it gives a nicotine rush and can make young people very sick. It comes in different strengths but anything over 50 mg is illegal in the UK. Below 50 mg it is an illegal substance for people under the age of 18, just as cigarettes and vapes are.

Snus is not a safe alternative to smoking or other forms of tobacco. It contains nicotine, a highly addictive substance, and numerous other harmful chemicals. The use of Snus carries a range of serious health risks. including:

- Nicotine Addiction: Snus delivers high levels of nicotine directly into the bloodstream, leading to rapid and severe addiction. Quitting can be extremely difficult, leading to withdrawal symptoms and continued health risks.
- Oral Health Problems: Prolonged use can cause gum recession, tooth decay, and other severe dental issues
- Increased Cancer Risk: Despite common misconceptions, Snus has been linked to an increased risk of various cancers, including oral cancer, pancreatic cancer, and oesophageal cancer.
- Cardiovascular Issues: Nicotine can elevate heart rate and blood pressure, contributing to a higher risk of heart disease and stroke.
- Other Health Concerns: Users may also experience nausea, dizziness, and other adverse effects.


