Dear parents and Carers,

New Beginnings

As we approach the end of the academic year, this past week has been a celebration of new beginnings. We were delighted to welcome our newest members of the Wyvern family – our incoming Year 7 students. On Tuesday, students from all our feeder schools joined us for their Year 6 Transition Day, where they took part in a wide variety of activities designed to help them settle in, make friends, and begin their secondary journey with confidence and excitement. We hope they can emulate the current Year 7 students who have set records for the lowest number of behaviour points, detentions and suspensions and the highest average PRIDe scores. We were also pleased to welcome a record number of Year 6 students who are not in our feeder schools or catchment area but who are also joining us in September from other local settings. Yesterday evening, we welcomed their parents and carers to our Year 6 Parent Information Evening.

We have several members of staff who are looking forward to new beginnings in September. Mrs Lowe in PE, Ms Ding, our cover teacher and Ms Charles, our librarian are all retiring after serving our college and local community for many years, with distinction and commitment. Miss Hampton and Mr Archer-Lock in Maths have secured promotions in other schools as they develop their careers. We also have some staff changing schools due to relocation: Mr Harrison in Drama, Ms Harper in Geography and Mrs Hooper in ICT/Creative imedia. We have also had some teachers who have been with us temporarily this year, who have successfully secured their next steps: Mr Kimber in PE, Mr Price in Art and Ms Lea our cover teacher. Mr Male is leaving to work for the local education authority. We wish all of them very well indeed and thank them for all the work the support they have given to our students.

Subject Awards Evenings

As head teacher there are some things I do out of duty and there are many things I do out of pleasure. It was a real pleasure to spend Monday evening with so many Year 9 and Year 10 students (and their parents) at our first ever subject awards evening. There are of course many, many other students in these year groups who are deserving of praise and recognition for their continual hard work, strong attendance and excellent behaviour. We have tried throughout the year to have a wide range of praise events: praise breakfasts, the praise trip to Thorpe Park and a new system of P1, P2 and P3s. We hope that throughout the year students will get some positive recognition for what they get right. We will make the subject awards evening an annual event and hope that over the course of their time with us at Wyvern, a wider number of students will be able to attend one of them. We have the key stage 3 awards evening tonight and I look forward to it being as inspiring as the key stage 4 one.

College Improvement

The SLT has been working on the CIP for the next two years. We will be able to share this with you when we have finished it but the headlines of it are all based around making every lesson count and have the biggest impact it can:

- More students in more lessons: improving attendance to college, and attendance and punctuality to lessons; further reducing the number of students coming out of class to use passes and go to the toilets.
- **Greater teacher continuity in lessons**: reducing the number of cover lessons and staff absence and ensuring that teachers are effectively trained to consistently deliver the best quality lessons. We have reduced the number of split classes (those with multiple teachers in one subject) for September but we want to reduce these even more for September 2026 by reviewing our timetable construction methods.
- **More learning in lessons**: making sure that we give each student the right level of stretch and challenge in their work, raising expectations for the quality and standard of work that students produce and supporting them to meet these higher standards.
- More progress across lessons: improving the quality of home learning, academic enrichment: tracking students' progress better and intervening earlier when students are not on track. This involves reviewing our Year 7 and Year 8 assessment, by reporting more clearly to parents what their child's attainment is and how this compares to age related standards of work.
- Less disruption to lessons: we have seen big improvements to behaviour at break times, in communal spaces and on issues like bullying, vaping and anti-social behaviour. We now need to have a concerted effort to minimise disruptive behaviour in lessons to protect other students' learning. So we will be putting in place measures to address the problem of students routinely disrupting lessons and routinely doing detentions for it.

Message from Southern Gas networks about local gas works

I am contacting you regarding our project to replace the metal gas pipes in Winchester Road, Fair Oak and Spring Lane, Colden Common.

We need to replace the old metal pipe with new Polyethylene pipe to continue to provide a safe and reliable gas supply. Our contractor, I&G contractors, started this project on 2 June in Fair Oak for approximately twelve weeks.

Who are SGN?

As the owner and operator of the gas network in your area, we provide commercial, Industrial and domestic properties with a gas supply in your community 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

Spring Lane

Our engineers will move to Spring Lane From 14th July for approximately six weeks. We will need to close the junction of Spring Lane and Main Road.

How will this affect you?

- Please allow additional time for your journeys.
- Please check with your local bus company to be aware of any delayed busses or suspended bus stops. Ongoing information on our project will be available on our website.

We understand that a road closure causes inconvenience to the local community, and we will use the quickest and safest engineering techniques to ensure that we complete the project as quickly as possible. Thank you for your continued patience and support.
