Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers.

Firstly, a huge thank you to all the students who were involved with the production last week and to all the parents who supported their child, with being in the production. The show was amazing and I was so proud to see our students put on such a high standard. My colleagues Mr Harrison & Miss Wood, in their article below, have shared my thoughts exactly.

Secondly, I am very pleased to be able to share with you the Ofsted report of our college which was published last week, following the inspection in December. You can read the full report here https://files.ofsted.gov.uk/v1/file/50238970

As you can see, Wyvern remains a good school. Unlike schools where a full inspection takes place, Wyvern has not been given separate grades for different areas of college life. When a good school is being re-inspected, it is subject to a short inspection to see if it remains good and the decision is that it does or it doesn't.

The first paragraph in any inspection report gives a short description of what life is like in the school. Ours says, "Wyvern College is inclusive with a strong community feel. Pupils respect diversity and feel confident to be different. Relationships are very positive. As one parent said, 'My daughter has flourished due to the positive role models and encouraging culture at this school.' Pupils feel safe and enjoy attending. The school's values of 'think, grow, care' underpin all aspects of school life. There are high expectations for what all pupils can achieve. The school strives to provide the same high-quality education to all pupils, regardless of their starting points or the challenges they face. Pupils consequently achieve well".

The report goes on to praise the college's behaviour management work, anti-bullying work, extra-curricular activities, curriculum design, SEND provision, safeguarding, teaching, character education, personal development work, careers programme and college leadership.

The inspectors have set the college two improvement priorities, both related to further developing the quality of teaching and learning in lessons. Firstly, the need to share the very best teaching practice across the college so that all subject areas are as good as the very best. This is about ensuring we have greater consistency in the quality of teaching. Secondly, more effective checking of students' learning in lessons so that the pace of the lesson and the level of difficulty to the work is better suited to all learners.

The inspectors evaluated the English, Maths, Languages and History departments in detail but also observed lessons in many other subjects. The inspectors said they found students to be polite, friendly and articulate, keen to talk about everything that is on offer at Wyvern and proud of their school.

Far from being content with these successes, we will continue to work hard to improve the college further. In addition to the Ofsted targets that have been set, we want to continue to tackle poor attendance and behaviour as well as the causes of these; to make lessons more engaging and fun; to personalise the curriculum more so it better meets the needs of all learners; to continue to strengthen SEND provision.

It has been a busy end of this half term, with lots of students getting involved in college events. I hope they are able to re-charge over the half term holiday and welcome them back on Monday 19th February
