Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

#### A busy week

Wyvern has been busier than ever this week. We have had House competitions in PE lessons, the Scholastic book fair, our local PCSOs talking to students about County Lines, Cross Country Championships, GCSE music performance showcase, rehearsals for GCSE Drama performances, the celebration of World Book Day and Yr11 NEA cook days.

Wyvern was also selected to participate in national benchmarking tests for year 11 standards of literacy and numeracy this week – as if year 11 students haven't sat enough exams! The sample of students who undertook these tests were superb and although the results are not shared, we know the national sample will be used to compare educational standards across different countries.

#### **Behaviour**

Having just analysed the latest behaviour data for the college, I'm pleased to report that there have been significant reductions in many anti-social behaviours including physical aggression, verbal abuse and bullying. The crackdown on students sharing a toilet cubicle has all but eliminated this behaviour which has significantly reduced vaping in the cubicles.

Where physical aggression does take place, it is almost exclusively in year 7, often as a result of play fighting escalating, as it was last year and the year before. We also continue to educate students on the dangers of physical aggression and in how to manage disagreements and conflict.

We have seen a reduction in detentions being given, an increase in attendance at detentions and a reduction in waiting time for detentions.

# **Parental support**

We have always benefited from strong parental support for the sanctions we set and by working with parents to give a common message to students, we can make clear to them the boundaries and expectations they need to guide them in making the right choices. However, in the last two weeks we have seen an increase in

the number of parents challenging sanctions. This surprises me as the rules (PRIDE and RESPECT) are well known to students, easily accessible to parents on our website (Behaviour policy) and have not changed. Nor have the consequences, which are equally well known.

Although government guidance on behaviour management makes clear schools do not need parental approval or consent when setting detentions and using isolation or suspension, we do value parental support. When students think their parents won't support the college they believe the rules don't apply to them and boundaries about acceptable behaviour become blurred. So please do support us in our efforts to maintain high standards.

# Safeguarding: TikTok Challenges

Sadly, in the news this week, another bright, kind and talented boy died as a result of chroming (inhaling toxic chemicals) - a worrying trend that I recently wrote to you about. Tommy-Lee Billington, from Lancashire, was just 11 years old when he died on Saturday at a sleepover. His dad, has blamed TikTok for the culture of viral challenges that many young people get swept along with.

Most TikTok challenges are harmless and often involve dancing, singing and sport. However, some challenges peer pressure children into doing dangerous things such as eating inedible objects, eating or drinking risky amounts of food or drink. Recent challenges have included the blackout challenge (holding your breath or being choked until you pass out); the silhouette challenge (taking and sharing videos of yourself naked in silhouette) and chroming.

So, for this week's safeguarding item I would like to offer advice on Tiktok. First of all, it's important to note that the age restriction for this social media platform is 16. However, if you have made the decision to allow your child to access it then you might like to control their use of it. Use family pairing (also known as family safety mode). This enables you to control the settings on your child's account from your phone. You'll need to download TikTok and link your account to your child's. Then, go to your profile, tap on the three line menu button at the top. Tap settings and privacy - family pairing - parent. Follow the same steps on your child's phone but choose.
