Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you to those of you who were able to meet with teachers for year 8 parents' evening last night and for those of you supporting our choirs in the Vocal Festival tonight at Thornden Hall which will also involves students from the junior and infant schools which are linked to Wyvern.

Some of you will be aware that we have had some staff absences in Science and Maths this half term. I am sorry that some students have not been able to have specialist teachers for all their lessons in one or both of these subjects. We have prioritised the year 11 classes to ensure they remain on track with preparations for their GCSE exams. We have additional specialist staffing for Science starting after Easter. We have also begun to recruit for next academic year, in areas where we know vacancies will occur and have been fortunate in attracting strong applicants; mainly teachers with considerable experience who wish to move schools. This is the case in Languages, English, Science and we are now also about to recruit for Maths too which is usually the hardest subject for recruitment - so if you do know any good Maths teachers then please encourage them to apply! We have also recruited well to our support staff posts, growing our Behaviour Support team, Safeguarding team and Admin team. You can always find details of any staff vacancies on our website under the "joining us" section.

We have further strengthened our Behaviour Support systems and processes. We now have alternative school placements set up with Swanmore College and Wildern School. One-day placement in another school is an alternative sanction to suspension. Like suspension, it involves a student completing a day of learning outside of college. Unlike, suspension, it means the student does this at another school, rather than at home. We are now currently using alternative school placement for those who disrupt the internal exclusion room and get their day if isolation there wrong, in terms of the work they do. Section 29A Education Act 2002 empowers schools to use this sanction and parental consent is not required in order for a school to direct a student to an alternative school placement, though parental support is something we do value with all our sanctions.

Next Thursday, 21st March, we will be supporting World Down Syndrome Day, through Portsmouth Down Syndrone association. Students and staff will be encouraged to wear bright socks, with their normal Wyvern uniform, as part of the Rock Your Socks initiative. Last week we celebrated World Book Day and I think Year 7 really enjoyed seeing staff dress up and guessing which character from which book they were as well as the other activities going on around the college.

I am inviting Y7s to apply for eight possible positions as Assembly Assistants starting on the first Monday back after the Easter break. • The deadline for work experience is slowly approaching for the March 29th 2024. We have started to sit with students to login to EBP South website, to ensure that they have applied before the deadline.

If students have applied on EBP South but do not yet have a confirmed placement: there are a number of jobs still available. EBP South will be working over the Easter holidays. Please bear in mind that this process can be slow as they are also processing own placements, and waiting on employers to respond to them.

If students would prefer to find their own work placement: please ask for an own placement form from Mrs Allen or myself. I do recommend finding an own placement if possible, as the process guarantees a placement and is a lot quicker.

If students have not yet applied for anything: it is important that this process is started as soon as possible. There is a guide available which we will email out shortly to all Year 10 students and parents. If you still have any questions after reading the guide, please contact myself or Mrs Allen and we can answer your questions or set up an in-person appointment to go through the process with you.

Please do remember that you cannot apply for both an own placement and an online placement with EBP South as they will charge, if cancelled after confirmation. If you would like to do an own placement since booking through EBP, then please let me know asap. The charge only applies in the event that you have accepted a placement with EBP or confirmed an own placement, and later change your mind.
