World Down Syndrome Day

Every year, on March 21, people across the world celebrate World Down Syndrome Day by wearing brightly coloured socks. March 21 is chosen because people with Down syndrome have 3 copies of their 21st chromosome. Socks were chosen because the karyotype of DS chromosomes actually looks like a pair of socks. We have students at Wyvern with Down Syndrome; they enrich the college with their talents, interests and personal qualities. Indeed, they set the example for others to follow in terms of friendship and care for others. The Portsmouth Down Syndrome Association has been helping us at Wyvern to raise student awareness of Down syndrome and helped in training our staff - you can also find out more information from their website including how to make a donation to support their excellent work. <u>Fundraising - Portsmouth Down Syndrome Association (portsmouthdsa.org).</u> This week students have been able to wear bright socks and have learned more about Down Syndrome.

Safeguarding

Emerald Chat is an anonymous chat website that encourages users to make new friends by engaging with strangers. It uses several aspects of popular social media platforms, such as feeds and Direct Messaging to encourage users. The app includes a paid 'Gold' membership, which allows users to send images, choose the gender of user they speak to and 'priority matching'. There have numerous reports of risky behaviour over the last few years. The platform claims to use AI technology and human moderation to detect nudity and other inappropriate imagery within the chats. Emerald Chat can be accessed via web browser. It does not currently have a mobile app, but it can still be used on web browser apps such as Safari. However, online safety experts discovered that the age verification is ineffective, with only a self-declaration statement to confirm that the user is over 18.

• **REMINDER** - The deadline for work experience is slowly approaching for the March 29th 2024. We have started to sit with students to login to EBP South website, to ensure that they have applied before the deadline.

If students have applied on EBP South but do not yet have a confirmed placement: there are a number of jobs still available. EBP South will be working over the Easter holidays. Please bear in mind that this process can be slow as they are also processing own placements, and waiting on employers to respond to them.

If students would prefer to find their own work placement: please ask for an own placement form from Mrs Allen or myself. I do recommend finding an own placement if possible, as the process guarantees a placement and is a lot quicker.

If students have not yet applied for anything: it is important that this process is started as soon as possible. There is a guide available which we will email out shortly to all Year 10 students and parents. If you still have any questions after reading the guide, please contact myself or Mrs Allen and we can answer your questions or set up an in-person appointment to go through the process with you.

Please do remember that you cannot apply for both an own placement and an online placement with EBP South as they will charge, if cancelled after confirmation. If you would like to do an own placement since booking through EBP, then please let me know asap. The charge only applies in the event that you have accepted a placement with EBP or confirmed an own placement, and later change your mind.
