Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

Update for the week

It has been another busy week in college. Year 10 Art and photography students have visited Harry Potter Studios and were shown set design as part of their education tour. Triple Scientists were visited by the National Space Agency. We had our final parents evening of the year for Yr7 and the first of our SEN drop-ins for parents of children with additional needs, to discuss Classplans.

This week in assembly, we have been teaching students about the importance of emotional intelligence; that while good grades and academic success are very important to their future success in life, so too are their abilities to:

- 1. Understand what they are feeling and why
- 2. Being able to regulate their emotions and express these positively and appropriately.
- 3. Recognising how others are feeling and why

Time

4. Being able to respond appropriately to others when they are feeling different emotions.

As you know, our college motto is Think, Grow, Care. The Think part is all about academic accomplishment, the grow part encompasses students finding personal fulfilment by developing friendships, interests, confidence, conscience and individuality; the care part is about helping others through kindness, team work, leadership and service.

In my assembly this week, I gave students examples of people recognising how others feel and responding appropriately: appreciating that new students to the college might feel apprehensive so introducing themselves and welcoming them; noticing students standing by themselves and inviting them to join in; becoming aware of students who are struggling with their work and offering to help them.

I also used as an example, recognising when their parents had had a long and stressful day, so making them a cuppa and doing some things around the house to help. So if your child has been behaving strangely positively this week, this might be why!

We will continue to talk to students about these social skills and emotional intelligences and it would be great if you could carry on these conversations at home. I remember thinking during the pandemic that one of the legacies of Covid might be that we have a more caring and empathetic society where people think more about others. Actually, at times it seems that people have become angrier and more confrontational.

Wellbeing

I would like to signpost you to KOOTH. This is a free, anonymous online counselling and emotional well-being service which is available to young people aged 11-25 in Hampshire. There are no waiting lists and you can

access counselling from qualified therapists up to 10pm 365 days of the year. KOOTH also provides an online interactive magazine, peer support and live forums. The website is: www.kooth.com

• Free School Meals – could your family be eligible? We would encourage all of our parents to check eligibility for free school meals. This is a quick application form found Free school meals for pupils up to 16 years old | Hampshire County Council (hants.gov.uk).

If you prefer we can process the application for you. Please contact the finance office with your National Insurance Number and your date of birth.

We strongly suggest all families apply even if you may think you are not eligible. We have often found that families who don't believe they are entitled to receive FSM's actually come back as eligible.

Even if the application is not successful, your information will stay on the government portal. This means that if your circumstances change in the future, your application status will update automatically.

If your application is successful, you child will start to receive free school meals immediately. This will include £2.80 discreetly added onto their lunch account each day, free stationary and revision guides supplied by the finance office, 50% reduction in the cost of educational school trips. - Railway Safety Information for Parents. Network Rail in partnership with Learn Live are working to help
 raise awareness by educating students about the dangers of the train tracks through interactive digital
 delivery. They want to get three simple messages across:
 - Being on the railway tracks is extremely dangerous
 - Trains can run at any time of day or night, even when not shown in the timetable, or on station information displays, or online.
 - On the Wessex and South Western Railway network trains are powered by a 'third rail' which carries 750v of electricity. This is always live, even when there are no trains running.

They have asked us to share the relevant safety videos with parents who can watch it at home. The session is less than 15 minutes and explains why it is important to stay safe near the tracks. Over 19 million students, parents and teachers from across the UK have already watched these videos which has led to a significant decrease in the number of incidents in their area through watching the safety videos.

Year 8 Notices Options 2024 Update

Your son/daughter may have mentioned that I visited their Year 8 in assembly on Wednesday morning to give them an update as phase 1 of the options process is now almost complete.

For those students that we have been unable to run their selected course due to low numbers, we have now interviewed and parents spoken to / contacted. As we explained earlier in the options' process, we cannot run courses that attract insufficient students, as they need to be financially viable.

The next stage of the process is for us to decide how many classes of each course we have the staffing to run and to then place each class into one of 4 option blocks to build a 'best fit' timetable.

We will do this so that the largest number of students can have all their preferred options. It might mean that some students' combinations of courses are not possible and this is most likely to be the case where they have chosen one or more courses where there is only one class and can therefore only be in one option block.

Inevitably there will be some students whose combination does not work and again those individuals will be seen in person.

It is probable that a couple of courses are going to be oversubscribed. Some courses are limited to a certain number of classes due to the number of specialist teachers available, specialist teaching classrooms available etc.

Where this occurs, we reduce the number of students in a course using the preference system, starting with students who selected a course as their 4th choice and so on.

Any student affected we will meet with and parents made aware.

I will endeavour to keep you updated.

I saw a number of really positive interactions with students able to produce some excellent work as well as feeling mistakes could be made openly in order to learn.
