Where to start with Seattle? This city is beautiful, with New Formalism Style contemporary architecture and older, Art Deco and Bauhaus Styles.

The Seattle Space Needle. The definition of tall, space age buildings, the Space Needle was built to withstand extreme earthquakes and wind speeds up to 200MPH. Designed by Edward E. Carlson and John Graham Jr, it was built by the Pentagram Corporation and inspired by the Fernsehturm Stuttgart in Germany.

The Seattle Central Public Library. The best-looking building I've ever seen, this library is probably the flagship/pinnacle/quintessential library for all libraries all over the world. It was constructed by The Hoffman Construction Co and was designed by Arup.

The Federal Office Building; Not the most exiting building in terms of purpose, the aptly named 'Office Building' was built by A. A. Denny, William Bell, and C. D. Boren and designed by James-Alfonso Wetmore.

The Museum of Pop Culture ; Located adjacent to the Space Needle, this space age and striking building measures 140,000 square feet, and was designed by Frank Gehry, and built by The Hoffman Construction Co. It includes a homage to Jimi Hendrix and Seattle based bands, such as Nirvana. Go check it out!

The Spitfire was first built in 1938. A major spitfire factory was in Woolston,Southampton. During the battle of Britain, Hitler tried to take control of Britain's skies. His greatest threat- The Spitfire. These planes only had their wings attached at Eastleigh airport, or more commonly known as Southampton airport. Southampton was high on Hitler's list. Firstly, for the port and secondly, it was the only manufacturer of spitfires at the time. The government bought a total of 2,400 spitfires! When the factory in Woolston was bombed, the government had a secret plan. They used secret factories, one of which was a garage in Salisbury!

Men, women and children alike all wore the same uniform, dungarees. They worked long hours with just an hour of lunch, making these planes, each of them had to sign a form of secrecy, they couldn't tell anyone they were working on making these planes - obviously... The factories were anywhere the German troops wouldn't be looking, some people helped build parts from their garages. Even when the shutter was open in that garage in Salisbury, no-one could tell Spitfires were being built there.

Here was the topic:


Describe what gold looks like to a blind person! Using all the senses - just not eyes...
