

# Year 10 Trial – Drama

**The Year 10 trial exam for Drama contains three different sections:**

- Section A – 5 multiple choice questions (relating to drama roles and responsibility, staging configurations and staging positioning)
- Section B – 3 questions about Noughts & Crosses (4mk, 8mk and 20mk)
- Section C – 1 question giving a live theatre review of Billy Elliot (32mk)

**What's assessed**

- Knowledge and understanding of drama and theatre
- Study of Noughts and Crosses knowledge
- Analysis and evaluation of Billy Elliot

**How it's assessed**

- Written exam
- Open book
- 68 marks
- 40% of GCSE
