



A LEVELS, VOCATIONAL PROGRAMMES OR A MIXED PROGRAMME?

You will decide whether to take A Levels (examinationbased), vocational courses (mainly coursework-based), or opt for a combination of the two.

Both A Levels and vocational courses at Barton Peveril provide first-rate experiences and opportunities for you. Vocational courses can be taken as a full-time programme (the equivalent of three A Levels) or part of a mixed programme (combined with a limited selection of A Levels).

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To be accepted at Barton Peveril you will need to:

- Meet our minimum entry requirements (below)
- Calculate your average GCSE score (see opposite)
- Meet individual subject requirements (see course pages).

ECONOMICS A LEVEL

WHAT YOU WILL LEARN:

Economics lets you explore society's production of goods on a local, national and international level. You will explore, assess and comment on the current economic climate, tackling guestions such as:

- How do we solve the problem of single-use plastic?
- What happens in a recession?
- What makes Google so powerful?

GERMAN A LEVEL

WHAT YOU WILL LEARN:

German offers a fantastic opportunity to develop your listening, speaking, reading and writing skills within the context of the German speaking world, broadening your vocabulary and learning more complex grammar.

In the first year you will learn about the changing state of family life, the digital world and youth culture, as well as traditions, festivals, life in Berlin and the world of the Arts within the German speaking world. In the second year you will broaden your studies looking at multiculturalism, politics and reunification.



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






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Business Management and Skills Level 2

What do I need to sign up?

You will need 4 GCSEs at Grade 3 or higher including English and Maths.

All learners without a GCSE at grade A*-C or 9-4 in English or Maths will be required, as a condition of the programme, to undertake either a GCSE or Functional Skills programme. Therefore, if you enter a programme with a Grade 3 in English or Maths, you will be required to take English or Maths as well.



Site Carpentry Level 2 Full-Time

What do I need to sign up?

You must have completed a level 1 course (I1AF at E.C.) in carpentry and joinery.

You will need 5 GCSEs at Grade 9-4 including English Language and mathematics.

For internal progression, you should have achieved L1 in the relevant area as well as progressing your GCSE English and mathematics (if below a Grade 4) as well as demonstrating that you have upheld the college values.

Guidance English Baccalaureate (EBacc) Updated 20 August 2019

The EBacc is made up of the subjects which are considered essential to many degrees and open up lots of doors.

Research shows that a pupil's socio-economic background impacts the subjects they choose at GCSE, and that this determines their opportunities beyond school.

A study by the UCL Institute of Education shows that studying subjects included in the EBacc provides students with greater opportunities in further education and increases the likelihood that a pupil will stay on in full-time education. Sutton Trust research reveals that studying the EBacc can help improve a young person's performance in English and maths.

The government's ambition is to see 75% of pupils studying the EBacc subject combination at GCSE by 2022, and 90% by 2025.

Wyvern's perspective

- ALL students should consider studying the E-Bacc subjects
- It ensures a broad, balanced and academic suite of GCSE qualifications
- It will ensure the widest possible range of opportunities Post 16
- It will be compulsory for Wyvern students whose Minimum Expected Grade is 5 or above

Almost everyone will follow a standard Science pathway in Y9/10/11

This leads to a Combined Science(2 GCSE's) qualification in Y11.

It will cover Physics, Biology and Chemistry and will be worth two GCSEs.

Triple Science

At the start of Y9 approx. 90 students will follow the Triple Science pathway which will consist of Biology, Chemistry and Physics – each a separate GCSE.

Entry onto Triple Science will be determined at the end of Y8 and will be based on the attainment level / PFG achieved during Y8 and PRIDe score.


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
