SOCIETY

Equalities officer

Help employers and organisations to treat people equally

Welfare rights officer

Help people to understand the benefits they're entitled to, complete forms, and make appeals

Immigration adviser

Give advice on asylum and protection, immigration, and nationality issues

LEGAL SUPPORT

Barrister's clerk

Help barristers to organise their workload, schedule meetings, and prepare for a trial

Paralegal

Prepare legal documents, organise case files, and carry out research related to laws

Legal secretary

Do admin tasks to help lawyers, like planning meetings, completing court forms, and updating files

LAW

Solicitor

Advise clients about the law and prepare documents for court cases

Barrister

Give legal advice and represent people in court

State prosecutor

Make sure that decisions to bring people to court are fair and likely to succeed

GOVERNMENT

Civil service officer

Manage teams within government departments, like health, education, or defence

Diplomat

Help to promote and protect national interests, companies, and citizens overseas

Government minister

Manage a government department and decide how to spend its budget
