## POLITICS AND LAW

### Equalities officer

Help employers and organisations to treat people equally

### Civil service officer

Manage teams within government departments, like health, education, or defence

### Barrister

Give legal advice and represent people in court

### Social researcher

Study and analyse social issues like unemployment, crime, poverty, and gender



## BUSINESS

### Charity director

Lead a charity's strategy, staff, and projects to achieve its mission

### Human resources officer

Plan staff policies, benefits, and training

### Recruitment consultant

Help companies to hire people and match jobseekers with suitable roles



## EDUCATION

### Philosopher

Write and teach about life's big questions

### Higher education lecturer

Teach students at university and carry out research

### Secondary school teacher

Prepare and deliver lessons for young people at school

## COMMUNITY

### Community development worker

Work with local communities to improve services and solve problems

### Family support worker

Support families through difficulties by giving guidance and practical help

### Trade union official

Defend the rights and interests of workers
