GOVERNMENT

Civil service officer

Manage teams within government departments, like health, education, or defence

Policy adviser

Analyse issues and advise the government on the best options and actions to take

Political campaign manager

Plan and run a politician's campaign to win elections and gain public support

Political scientist

Study political systems and use research to explain how governments and elections work

COMMUNITY

Community development worker

Work with local communities to improve services and solve problems

Charity director

Lead a charity's strategy, staff, and projects to achieve its mission

Trade union official

Defend the rights and interests of workers

Activist

Campaign for social or political change through protests, petitions, and community action

BUSINESS AND LAW

Intelligence officer

Collect and analyse information to help keep your country and military safe

Barrister

Give legal advice and represent people in court

Communications officer

Share news and information about a company and what it does
